Principal's Address

With regards to pride, I would like to share an extract from our very recent local authority behaviour audit with you: *"Erccall Wood Academy is a calm, purposeful and orderly environment in which pupils behave respectfully and feel known, valued and safe. Relationships are a significant strength, with staff modelling the principles of Empowerment, Respect and Aspiration in daily interactions. These values are woven through the behaviour curriculum, encapsulating a relational, trauma-informed and moral-purpose approach aligned with the EEF's guidance on improving social and emotional skills."* It is an absolute credit to all who drive these high standards relentlessly so that students have an environment where they are happy, healthy, safe and where they can develop academically but also grow as young adults who will no doubt contribute greatly to society.

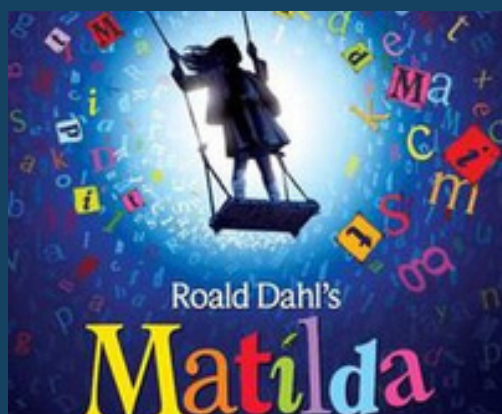
DANCE

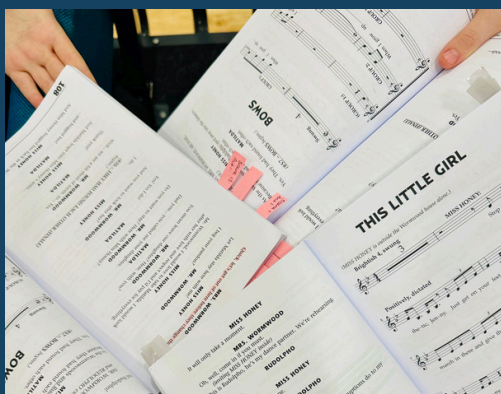

Students got to learn about the site and its background history in their lessons at the academy, before going to visit Trentham Gardens to collect their data on how the regeneration has impacted the site. Our students spoke confidently to members of the public and their conduct on the day was fantastic. Some of our students even had a few minutes to collect some of their data from Santa's sleigh.

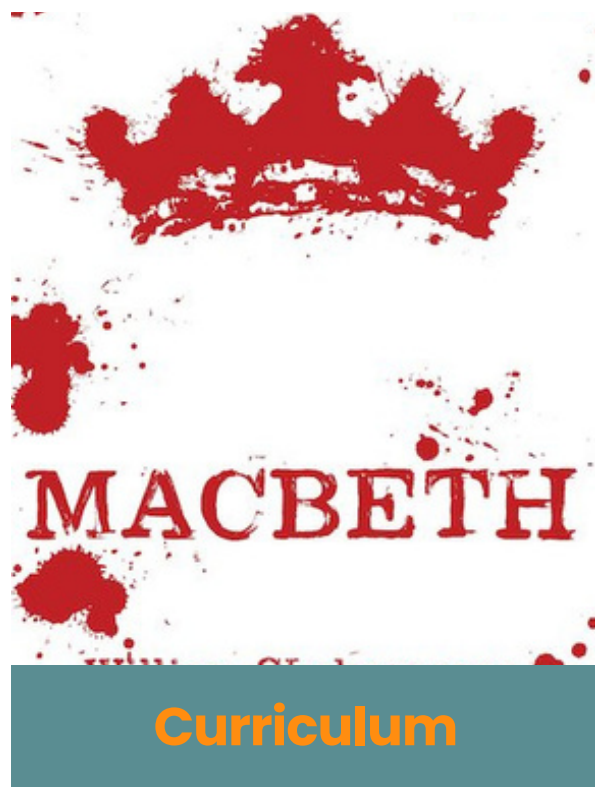
• KS3 Curriculum

ENGLISH

In Autumn term, English students begin at the earliest point of literary heritage studied at Ercall Wood Academy, as part of their chronological sequencing of the curriculum. All year groups have been engaged in their study of William Shakespeare – **Year 7** have judged whether Shylock is an outsider in Merchant of Venice; **Year 8** have analysed tragic love in Romeo and Juliet; **Year 9** have evaluated the impact of the supernatural in The Tempest and **Year 10** have begun their GCSE Literature course with the study of Macbeth.

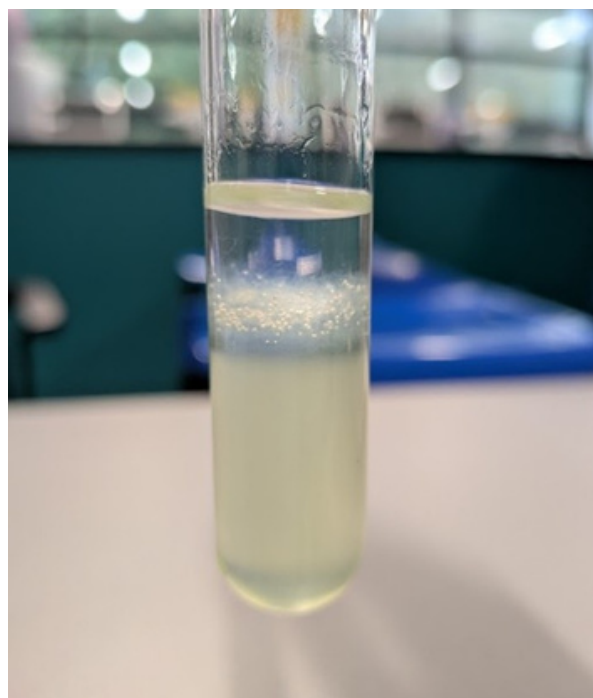

It's been a great term in the PE Department with the students braving some wintery conditions to achieve well in the core Football and Basketball units they have been studying. The assessment results clearly indicate that students have developed their motor skills and have become competent in applying them in a range of game-based scenarios. It has been especially important to see students using key terminology when providing feedback and coaching tips to their peers. The newly introduced observation and conversation sheets have allowed staff to demand even higher quality verbal responses, building a wider and more fluent understanding in the process. In Basketball, it has been nice to see students improving their tactical knowledge and awareness.

One of the highlights as we reached the end of a fantastic term, was the celebration evening for our 'Respect' Awards. Over 200 families came to see their loved one be awarded the coveted 'R' badge in gold or silver. For all of our **Year 7** and **Year 9** students, it was the result of a terms worth of work completing the tasks we assigned in September.

Students had to provide evidence of demonstrating that they understood the fundamentals of 'Respect' including how they present themselves, their learning and their equipment. The whole academy focused on 'Integrity' in the first half of term. This was extended during the next focus on 'Empathy', the second component of our 'Respect' focus. Students explored different points of view, shows of kindness towards others and appreciate that others need help and support. It's amazing to see young people so committed to being a better citizen, a better student and a better person. We all hope this work will bring them opportunities in the future.

Many **Year 8** and **Year 10** students have now secured their badge after narrowly missing out last year. A distinctive feature of our character framework is that opportunity to keep striving for things even if they allude you at first attempt. It's almost the whole point of developing your character.

MFL

Cross-curricular trip to Munich – 26th–29th March 2026.

We are excited that our Year 10 GCSE students of German and History will be taking part in a joint Trip to Munich from 26th to 29th March 2026. This enriching four-day visit will bring their classroom learning to life.

Students will take part in an insider Third Reich-themed walking tour of Munich, exploring key locations. They will also visit the Dachau Concentration Camp Memorial, a powerful and reflective experience that supports their studies of the period.

The itinerary includes time at the Olympia Shopping Centre and the Allianz Arena, offering opportunities to practise their German language skills. The group will then travel to Nuremberg to visit the Documentation Centre and former Nazi Party Rally Grounds, followed by the Memorium Nuremberg Trials, where students will learn about the post-war pursuit of justice.

We believe this special trip will provide students with meaningful insights into Germany's history, culture, and legacy, supporting both their language learning and their historical understanding.

ETHICS

New Learning Resources

This term we've introduced a series of new booklets designed to support students in developing a deeper understanding of ethical and religious principles and themes. These resources aim to make learning more accessible and interactive, helping students apply their ethical and religious learning to real-world situations.

Curriculum Enhancements

To better meet the needs of our learners, we have updated and enriched the ethics curriculum. These changes focus on critical thinking, oracy and discussion-based learning, and practical application, ensuring students are well-prepared for the complexities of modern society.

Year 7 have been looking at Ethics and morality – themes of what is right and what is wrong and how we learn this – 'Where do we learn our moral compass?'

Year 8 have been looking at small religions such as Paganism, Cao Dai and Shintoism.

Year 9 have been looking at one of the themes at GCSE Religion Crime and Punishment, considering what a crime is and the different methods of punishment, whether punishment works and how some religion's view criminals.

Year 10 have begun the GCSE course, and I am really pleased with their enthusiasm. So far, we have covered Islam Beliefs and Practices, and they have recently sat a full paper on Islam, results to be given back to them very soon!

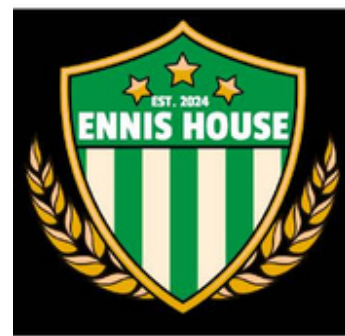

Over the last several weeks, students have been working hard to develop their own product concepts, conduct market research, and create promotional strategies that would stand out in a competitive marketplace. The Dragon's Den pitch gives students the chance to bring their work to life. 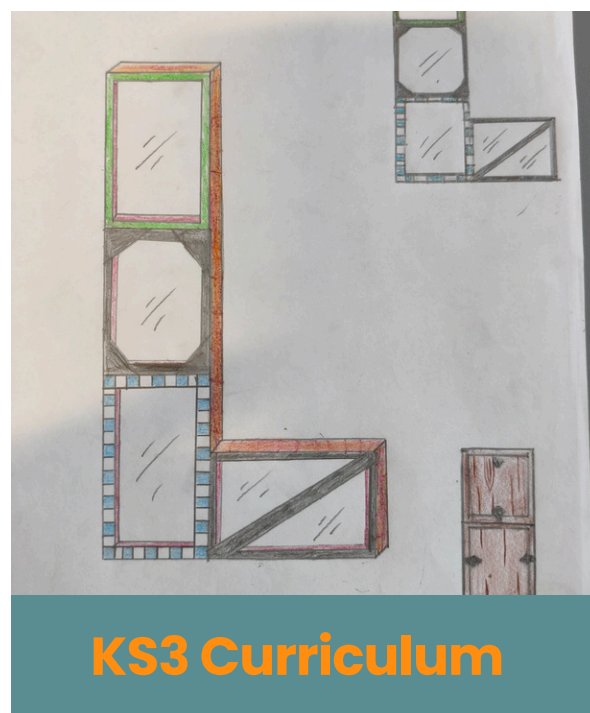
